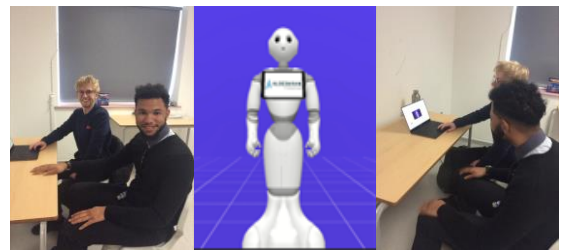

Robotic Research

The University of Lincoln are investigating the ability of children in detecting emotions that are displayed through a virtual robot.



Tom & Julia are visiting our school to show the participants the project videos of a robot displaying different emotions & asking them if they can label the emotion. They have also had to decide if the robot's action & voice are the same emotion or different. The study is looking to see which kind of emotions children are better able to identify.

We are excited to hear about the results once the study is completed. All children who took part have shown real confidence in meeting Tom & Julia.

Free school meals

If you receive any benefits, you should tell your school as they can get extra funding called the Pupil Premium grant. This includes: • Universal Credit - your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get) • Income Support • Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance • Income-related Employment and Support Allowance • Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 • The guaranteed element of state Pension Credit • Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more £16,190) • Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit Children who get paid these benefits directly can also get free school meals.
